Adult Behaviour and Language in the Playground

St George's has no wish or remit to police the local area. Any issues or worries between parents or other members of the public should be dealt with by contacting the correct authorities, whether they be the police, social services or whoever.

Where school does become concerned is when it affects the children and especially their happiness in school. Life and other people can be extremely frustrating at times but I would ask **all parents** to be mindful of that little person next to you and what they are hearing or feeling if you 'let off steam'

We do have trained Pastoral Support Workers here and if you have an issue you feel is affecting your children adversely outside school, we are always happy to speak to you.

Where school must take action is where there is inappropriate behaviour, aggression, malicious gossiping or bad language in the playground by adults. If this happens on school premises then school has to do the following:

- 1) Challenge this behaviour politely and offer support
- 2) Meet with the parent, explain the consequences of continued unacceptable behaviour
- 3) Ban a parent/carer from picking up their children for a period of time or indefinitely
- 4) Contact the Police or Children's Services if an unlawful act is being committed or there is a serious safeguarding issue.

We **all** want the best for the children. Please help us to keep the atmosphere in the school playground calm, positive and safe.
